

## Paul Disbrow Moody

Paul Disbrow Moody, age 48, passed away June 14, 2001, at the Hospice Home of Hope in Fond du Lac, WI, after a lengthy bout with cancer. He was born on May 20, 1953, in New Fairfield, CT. He was raised on a portion of the Disbrow Farm and was an ancestor of a founding member of New Fairfield in 1745. He graduated from New Fairfield Grammar Schools and Danbury High School in 1971 and was active in the Boy Scouts. He was a 1976 graduate of Syracuse University with a degree in Architecture.

He married his best friend of 18 years, Jane Marie (Pekarske) Augustine, of Manitowoc, WI, on November 5, 1998, in Fond du Lac. Together they traveled the country in a motor home for four years until his death.

Paul is survived by his wife, Jane, currently of Fond du Lac; his parents, Harry and Joanne Moody of New Fairfield, CT; a brother, Mark, also of New Fairfield; and a twin sister, Lee Hammond Moody of Durham, CT. He is also survived by his mother-in-law, Alice (Theyerl) Piekarski, currently of Fond du Lac; and by uncles, aunts, nephews, nieces, cousins, step-children and grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his grandparents, Harry L. and Phebe Disbrow Moody, and Atty. Kenneth and Esther Erickson Silliman. His father-in-law, John A. Piekarski, preceded him in death in 1994.

There will be a private graveside memorial at the Disbrow family plot at Mountainview Cemetery in New Fairfield. A date is to be determined.

Paul will be remembered as a commercial architect for office buildings, malls and department stores across the country. He was a partner in architectural firms in Cleveland, OH, and Seattle, WA. Upon retirement in 1997, he designed his sister, Lee's, and Walter Konior's home in Durham, CT; his step-children, Barbe and Jeffrey Ratzburg's lake home in Fond du Lac, WI, and houses in Washington State, Colorado and Texas. He was also an excellent carpenter (a family attribute), and his periodical travelogues will be missed by family and friends, as well as his and Jane's visits from coast to coast.
